## **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Steven Ray Pierce was born in Louisville, KY Oct. 19, 1946. He attended public schools in Louisville, Kentucky and graduated from Georgetown College (Kentucky) in 1968. While working on a PHD in mammalian ecology at the University of Kentucky, Pierce was drafted into the United States Army, where, after attending Laboratory Technologist training, specialized in blood banking and served at Brooke Army Medical Center in San Antonio and at the USAREUR Blood Bank, Landstuhl, Germany.

Upon returning to civilian life, Pierce attended the Specialist in Blood Banking training program at the Community Blood Center in Dayton, Ohio. He received a Specialist in Blood Banking (SBB) certification in 1973 and moved to Kansas City, where he worked at the Community Blood Center of Greater Kansas City as Supervisor of the Immunohematology Laboratory and later as Assistant Technical Director, Clinical Services. Pierce retired in January, 2002 but continued to do research and lecture on the history of blood group serology and transfusion.

Steve Pierce served on the Board of Directors of the American Association of Blood Banks, from 1981-1985, the years in which AIDS came to public attention. The AIDS epidemic caused him to get involved in the gay and lesbian community of Kansas City. He served as President of the Gay and Lesbian Services Network for several years. Activities in GLSN included directing Gay Talk, a peer counseling hotline, and the Condom Crusader program, providing extensive HIV/safer sex education. He also served on the Mayor's Task Force on AIDS and the Kansas City AIDS Council. Pierce was active in the Pink Triangle political association and was a founding member of Kansas City's Human Rights Project. He helped write Kansas City's antidiscrimination ordinance, passed in 1993. In addition to his numerous other activities he made time to do volunteer work at the Hope Care Center, a residential nursing home serving people with HIV/AIDS.

## **SCOPE AND CONTENT**

The Steven R. Pierce Collection was gifted in July 2010 to LaBudde Special Collections by Pierce. The collection ranges in dates from 1983-1993 and contains a plethora of information dealing with the AIDS epidemic during a period when there was much trepidation and ignorance regarding this disease. The materials within this collection are focused on education; myth busting and bringing overall awareness to the forefront.

Numerous entities came together to fight not only for the Rights of the Gay and Lesbian Community, but to educate all people to the danger which exist from AIDS, regardless of sexual orientation. The Gay Talk Network evolved into the Gay Services Network, which then became the Gay and Lesbian Services Network. The Condom Crusaders and the Gay and Lesbian Alliance eventually contributed to the mix. In addition to addressing AIDS, this networking catered to the counseling of all Gay Rights Issues and sponsored LBGT social and civil events.

The Pierce Collection is divided into ten series. The bulk of educational materials was generated by the Condom Crusaders Organization and contains pamphlets; books; posters and periodicals. In addition to the Condom Crusaders, other programs formulated during this movement were the AIDS Council and the Mayor's Task Force on AIDS. Documents from those programs are archived within this collection.

The gems of this collection can be found within the ephemera and memorabilia. The leaflets; comic books; posters and other educational materials are eye-opening and the memorabilia, such as the souvenir buttons and expressive condom containers are quite impressive. Overall this collection is packed with riches for any researcher driven to this field of study. The donor delivered a collection to the archives that had been methodically organized and highlighted with informational snippets which proved invaluable during the archival process.

## **SERIES NOTES**

### **SERIES I: AIDS PROGRAMS**

Series I is located in boxes 1-3 and is divided into five sub-series. Sub-series A: AIDS Council; B: Mayor's Task Force On AIDS; C: Blood Banks; D: Condom Crusaders and E: Other. These materials were originally organized and identified by the donor and were kept as such with the exception of periodicals, educational handouts and posters, which were designated to their individual series.

### **SERIES II: SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS**

Series II is found in boxes 3 and 4 and is divided into four sub-series by organization. Included are: Gay & Lesbian Alliance; Gay Talk; Gay & Lesbian Services Network and Gay Services Network. The materials contain mostly financial information. The Gay & Lesbian Services Network originated as Gay Talk, which was then established as Gay Services Network and eventually became Gay and Lesbian Services Network. It grew to include, in addition to Gay Talk, the Condom Crusaders and GALA.

### **SERIES III: INFORMATIONAL/EDUCATIONAL MATERIAL**

This series is located in boxes 4-7 and is separated into three sub-series, including Leaflets; Guidebooks/Handbooks/Booklets and Handouts/Flyers. The greater part of these materials was extracted from the Condom Crusaders Program. They are in no particular order, but all titles are listed and searchable.

### **SERIES IV: PERIODICALS**

Periodicals are located in boxes 7 and 8 and are organized in alphabetical order by title. Oversized periodicals can be found in box 14. The periodicals contain magazines; bulletins; newsletters and catalogs.

### **SERIES V: RESEARCH FILES**

Series V is located in boxes 8-10 and contains materials primarily dealing with AIDS. There are numerous journal articles; a Health Survey and some news clippings.

### **SERIES VI: MISCELLANEOUS**

This series is located in box 10 and contains items that did not fit within previous nor following series. Included are Curriculum Vitae; press releases; correspondence; paperbacks, etc.

### **SERIES VII: EPHEMERA/MEMORABILIA**

Series VIII is located in boxes 10-12. There is a vast array of items relating to the Condom Crusaders. Comic books; expressive condom containers; postcards; business cards; small booklets and souvenir buttons are included. A number of custom T-Shirts have been relocated to the Kansas City Museum.

### **SERIES VIII: CALENDARS**

The calendars are found in box 13 and encompass the years 1987-1993. Publications are *Image Is*; *Kansas City Prime* and *International Male Calendar*.

**SERIES IX: POSTERS**

Series IX can be found in boxes 13 and 15. Several larger posters are found in Map Drawer 26. The posters have been sorted into categories of “Missouri Responds to AIDS”; “America Responds to AIDS” and “Various Posters.” Within those designations, they are organized in alphabetical order by title and listed in the finding aid.

**SERIES X: PHOTOGRAPHS.**

Series X consists of snapshots of various people, places and events. Included are shots of local gay bars; Gay Pride picnics in 1988 and 1989; March on Washington events in 1987 and 1993; and the Condom Crusaders.
